Project Hope's Creative Writing Exhibit a powerful look at addiction

Through the windows in the hallway leading up to the Lawrenceburg Main Library Depot Room, you can see the totem pole filled with images displayed in the courtyard.

These images were created by members and alumni of the Dearborn County Jail Chemical Addictions Program, working to walls leading up to the Depot help people recovering from chemical dependency issues.

Visual art is one way for those recovering to tell their story, find ways to heal and give back something positive to the community through a program called Project Hope.

Now, lined along those same



Room, Project Hope returns Thursday, April 20, with some of these raw and heartfelt feelings and experiences shared in words.

Dearborn County JCAP Alumni's Project Hope and the Lawrenceburg Public Library District will present a Creative Writing Reception and Exhibit

of over 40 writings about addiction recovery.

The reception will begin at noon April 20 with speakers and light refreshments. A smaller questions-only reception will be held from 3:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. Everyone is welcome to attend.

Be aware the content will contain unedited, adult themes about addiction.

The display was inspired by The Clothesline Project, which hangs t-shirts on a clothesline, decorated by women who have hours Thursday, April 20, until experienced violence, said Dearborn County JCAP Director of Clinical Services Tisha Linzy.

Creative writing offers a different outlet, in addition to the more visual art Project Hope has facilitated, with the help of local artist LeAnn Price, she said.

The writings were collected over the course of a year. A lot of them address saying goodbye to addiction, she said.

"I think it will be a powerful, unique art installation," said Linzy.

The exhibit will be open for viewing during regular library Saturday, April 29, Lawrenceburg Main Library. Library closed on Sundays








Seven Girls Gone






























Hear 10 Poems that Rocked the World


