So this year we are implementing some new programs to thank the patrons currently using our services and encourage others whose return to the library is long overdue.

Happy Birthday!

The first program is open to everyone! Stop by the circulation desk at the Lawrenceburg Main Library or North Dearborn Branch on your birthday (or the next day if the library is closed on your birthday) and receive 5 Library Bucks!

The Library Bucks can be used to pay overdue fines or replacement card fees.

With the fees out of the way, you can relax and enjoy everything the library district has to offer including books, e-books, audiobooks, music, movies, puzzles, games, cake pans- we could go on and on.

New Adults

OK. So you had a youth library card, but there are some fines built up from when your mom forgot to return that DVD or book on time. What could you do? You were 14. You could not drive yet. Or maybe your baby brother "borrowed" your card and lost the book for two months.

Do not let that hold you back from returning to the library because we have some good news!

Patrons who upgrade their library card registration from Young Adult to Adult can have up to \$25 in overdue fines and replacement card fees waived if the fines were charged prior to their 18th birthday. Does not include lost or damaged item fees.

Long Expired

Has your library card been expired for more than 3 years? Do you fear possible fines and fees? Now you have a one-time opportunity to clear up some lingering late fines and lost card fees up to \$25. Does not include lost or damage item fees.

Meet Maisy! Read to her during the Barks and Books program

There is a new face at the Lawrenceburg Public Library District.

Meet Maisy! She is joining the Barks and Books programs that takes place the third Saturday of each month at the Lawrenceburg Main Library and the North Dearborn Branch.

She will join Bella, who already is a familiar face to anyone who has participated in the program. Maisy is stepping in for LouLou, who we all miss after passing away last year.

The times each dog will visit may change a little month-to-month, but for February there will be a pup at the Lawrenceburg Main Library from 11 a.m. to noon, then the North Dearborn Branch from 12:30 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 18. No registration is needed. Just stop by!

Dogs make great listeners and reading out loud to them can improve reading comprehension and confidence.

Grab a book and take a paw to read out loud to a trained therapy dog!

Maisy's owner, Laura Priebe,

said Maisy is a pandemic pup, surrendered by her original owners. She joined the family after their two other dogs died suddenly.

"We knew we needed to fill that empty spot with another dog. When we met her in January 2021, she stayed so nicely and was so soft, we knew she was meant for us," said Priebe.

As they put in the time and money to train Maisy, it was decided to take it a step farther and get her certified as a therapy dog.

"I want her to bring more love to the world," said Priebe.

Maisy did not pass her first attempt, but now she is therapy dog official.

Set to turn 3 in April, Maisy is a retriever mix, and has many qualities of that breed, said Priebe.

"She has the soft coat of a golden, the short hair of a lab and the good nature of each," she said.

Priebe and Maisy also plan on making visits to nursing homes, the hospital and schools in the future.

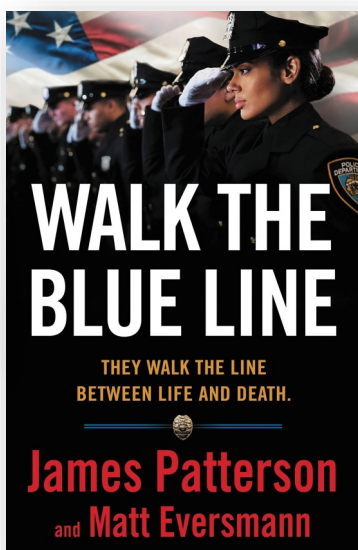
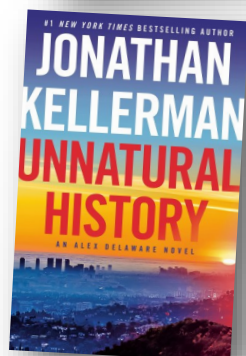

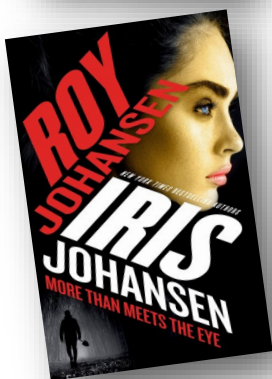


Walk the Blue Line

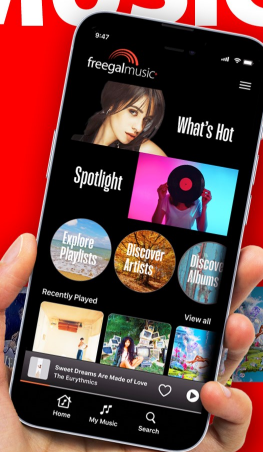

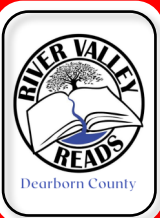
