1,000 Books Before Kindergarten





Meet Marcia Parcell. She is the Health and Human Sciences Educator for Purdue Extension— Dearborn County. She has offered many programs at the Lawrenceburg Public Library District through the years including In the Kitchen with Marcia and Minecraft and Munchies (the food part). She also is currently helping present A Matter of Balance and streaming a live cooking show once a month from the Lawrenceburg Main Library.

Tell us a little bit about your family.

My family is a blended family. Bill, my husband, and I have five children plus two daughters-in-law. Our family loves cats and dogs. Bill and I enjoy the company of three cats, Lucky, Shadow, and Cookie, and one dog, Samson.

Where are you from originally?

I was born and raised on a farm in Sunman with six brothers and a sister. I went to St. Nicholas School. For high school, I attended the Immaculate Conception Academy. Upon graduation from ICA, I went to Ball State University to study teaching. I earned a Bachelor of Science degree with a Computer Endorsement from Ball State. I have served as a member of a Diversity Team, which lead to being trained to facilitate Navigating Difference. I am a trainer for Mental Health First Aid for Adults. In 2022, I served as the president of the Health and Human Sciences Educators in Indiana. I am currently in the role of Vice President of Professional Development for the National

plat the Cat Read-alongs


Wonderbook read-alongs are a children's print book with a pre-loaded audiobook player permanently bound to the inside cover.


