

Artist chosen for Library Select Award

When Ann Seaver's granddaughter traveled to Europe last summer, she sent her a lot of pictures.

One in particular caught her eye- a scene from the lakeside town of Hallstatt, Austria.

Her colored pencil rendition of the photo, in turn, caught the eye of Lawrenceburg Public Library District Services and Resources Foundation members. They decided to recognize Seaver with the Library Select Award during the Southeastern Indiana Art Guild's members-only spring show in Aurora in April.

"I enjoyed this piece because it evokes a sense of escape and calm. The water is beautifully rendered to reflect the town, and the trees behind create an isolating effect. It's a place we can all imagine ourselves visiting and drinking some coffee or wine while reading by ourselves or having a conversation with a new friend," Jake Moore, director of the Lawrenceburg Public Library District.

A member of the art guild for about 35 years, the Aurora native started taking art lessons in high school.

"I was always interested in art," said Seaver.

She tried oils and watercolors before switching to colored pencils, something she really loves.

Seaver said she learned about art from many people over the years. She currently attends Vera Curnow's art class at the Dearborn Adult Center in Lawrenceburg.

"The piece we selected was so well done. Looking at it, I almost felt like I was right there in that setting. We look forward to working with Ann- and partners like Chris Campbell, current vice president of the art guild- to spread the arts and art education throughout our community,"
