



Fall art show artists win special awards



Artist Marilyn Brauer's watercolor painting *Winter Respite* was voted the People's Choice Award winner during the fall art show at Lawrenceburg Main Library.

Three artists were given special recognition during the South-eastern Indiana Art Guild Fall Art Show held for a week in October at the Lawrenceburg Main Library.

Lawrenceburg Public Library District Services and Resources Foundation's Library Select Award was given to Christine Campbell, Lawrenceburg, for her paper mosaic *Ponderous*.

Underpainted in different areas with watercolor and acrylic paints, the paper used for the ear of the elephant is from the inside of the security envelopes used to mail bills.

The artwork means a lot to Campbell, who picked the subject to honor her mother who passed away a year ago. Her mother loved elephants because they are known to carry burdens effortlessly, similar to the graciousness her mother embodied through life's tough moments, said Campbell.

Lawrenceburg Mayor Kelly Mollaun selected *Reflections* by Bright resident Pamela Yahl for the Mayor's Choice Award. A member of the art guild for only four months, Yahl said she was happy but surprised to receive the award. She painted the Roebling Suspension Bridge in Cincinnati from a photo she took.

After a week of voting from the public, artist Marilyn Brauer's watercolor painting *Winter Respite* was chosen for the People's Choice Award.
