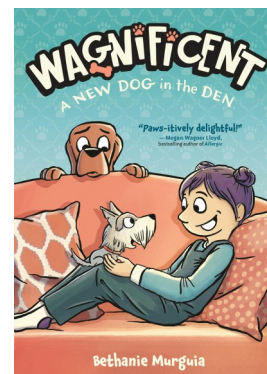
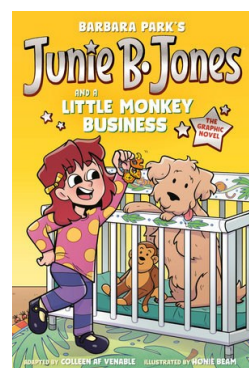
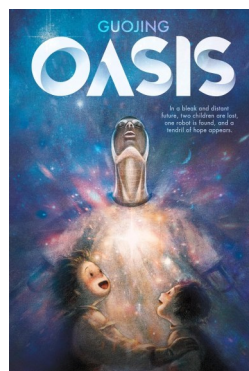
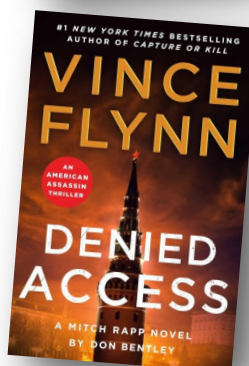


The Academy

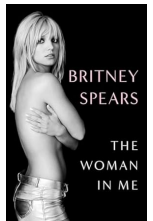
